Assessment Week for 4th - 8th Graders

In order to better prepare our Middle School students for high school, we give a major assessment in our core subjects (ELA, Math, Social Studies, Science) at the end of the 2nd nine weeks. Students are required to take the exam. These assessments are part of their 2nd nine weeks grade. Please see the Assessment Week schedule below, and talk to your child about the importance of taking these assessments seriously. Teachers may give study guides for these tests.

Students are expected to be in attendance for each exam day. No exam will be made-up unless there is a serious illness with a doctor's note. Make up exams will be Tuesday, December 18th after school. Students are responsible for all material covered within the first semester class. A study guide and/or Content review will be given at the discretion of the teacher.

It's hard to believe that we have already completed the first half of the school year. It is important to recognize that success in school is not only measured by the calculated grade, but in fact, students need to be aware of their strengths and weaknesses for future success and development. In order to prepare students for the future (high school), these exams are an important training tool for standardized tests that come in the Spring and for their educational future. Please work with them to study and prepare adequately for these exams.

Zaiya is a student who strives to do her best in every subject. If she does not get the material the first time, she continues with passion and a smile on her face.


